Searching for a Scholarly Journal Article in ProQuest


STEP ONE: Select an Article Database

A database can also be called a “periodical index”. The database, or index, provides subject access to articles appearing in a variety of periodicals (i.e., journals, magazines, newspapers, publications, etc). Most of our databases concentrate on scholarly journals as their information base.

A very important part of your search is selecting the correct database for your topic. For many topics related to Religion, ProQuest Religion is an indispensable resource for religious studies programs and for anyone researching religious issues and perspectives. This resource presently has more than 150 journals, with most of them available with full-text. The content is full-text, scholarly, and designed to meet the needs of religious studies.

[ProQuest Computing](#) Search top computing journals in full text for research on subjects such as database design, software development, web commerce, LANs, WANs, Intranets, and the Internet.

[ProQuest Military Collection](#) Search a comprehensive collection of material on military subjects such as defense, aeronautics and space flight, civil engineering, political science, and more.

[ProQuest Newspapers](#) The financial newspaper of record offering in-depth coverage of national and international finance as well as first rate coverage of hard news.

[ProQuest Religion](#) Search a comprehensive collection of journals covering religious issues and perspectives, including religious news and information, commentaries on topics of general interest from the perspective of a particular religion, and formal theological studies.

[Science Journals \(ProQuest\)](#) Search full text and images for the leading periodicals in science and technology. Subject coverage includes computers, engineering, physics, telecommunications, and transportation.

STEP TWO: Search the Database - instructions for CINAHL

Beyond Sacred Violence: The Challenge of Kathryn McClymond for Christian Apologetics

Abstract (Summary)
Goode critically assesses the argument of McClymond's book, evaluates its implications for Girardian anthropology, considers the wider picture of non-Girardian atonement theology, and discusses the encouraging possibilities that McClymond's argument might offer for the development of alternative anthropologies through engaging a fuller range of ritual phenomena than simply Girard's. Kathryn McClymond's work offers a long overdue and very cogent critique of sacrifice as violence. The relegation of sacred violence to the status of a contemporary mytheme pulls out the anthropological thread from beneath Girardian theory. On the other hand, it poses a more general challenge to Christian apologetics to develop an anthropology based on a broader and more genuinely cross-cultural understanding of sacrifice grounded in such things as there exists of the ritual practices of elsewhere and yesteryear. Finally, the link between sacrificial benevolence and the acquisition of socioreligious status is proposed as one fruitful avenue for any future Christian apologists seeking an anthropological standpoint from which to approach the New Testament concept of grace.

STEP FOUR: Revise your Search

Looking at the list of major subject headings associated with the article you are viewing is often a good place to look for better search terms. STEP FIVE: Locate the article

If the article you are looking for is not available "full-text" in the ProQuest Religion database, it may be available in another database or format that SAU owns.
